Template letter

Using the template letter provided, you can write to all your residents/families to find out how many buttons they require.



Payment options

They can either write a cheque made payable to your care home for the appropriate amount, OR opt for it to be taken directly out of their Personal allowance account.

Online form

Order processing

Buttons will be despatched same or next day with relevant number of fasteners included. An invoice will be sent to the email address provided. This will be equal to the payment the home has already received from the resident/family.

On receiving your first order we will send you a Starter Kit free of charge. This will include everything you need for attaching and removing the buttons. We will also provide you with leaflets to give to residents/families with information about the product.

Ordering for the whole home...

Colour coded buttons

Many homes like to take advantage of the colour coding and reusability of the buttons. The buttons can be numbered according to your home's room numbers, and colour coded for different floors or areas of the home. The buttons can be easily removed and re-attached for the next resident going into that room, making it an in-house labelling system.



Equipment package

For the whole home approach we would simply need a list of your room numbers and the relevant colours. As part of the system you will receive all the necessary equipment for attaching and removing the buttons, and wall-mountable storage cabinets. The trays will be colour coded to match your buttons. Please speak to a member of our sales team to discuss your requirements and provide you with a bespoke quote.

Deposit scheme

To kit out the whole care home at zero cost to the home and residents, you can offer a deposit scheme. The care home would cover the initial cost, with the residents/families paying a deposit to 'borrow' the buttons for the length of their stay. The sum of these deposits is equal to the cost of the system. When a resident leaves, their deposit is returned and the next resident pays their deposit to 'borrow' the same set of buttons.
