BLOOD SPILLS



Wear disposable gloves and apron. Safety glasses with side shields are required whilst handling the tablets granules and tablets only



Dispense Actichlor Granules directly onto the wet blood spill and leave for 2 minutes and dispose as clinical waste.



Dissolve Actichlor Plus tablets (according to dilution instructions below) in cold water to make your solution.

Carefully pour over towels. Leave for 2 minutes and dispose as clinical waste

Place paper towels over blood spill.



Clean and disinfect an area larger than the spill with your Actichlor Plus solution (prepared according to dilution instructions below)



Keep solution for no longer than 24 hours. Dispose of remaining solution into DSR or sluice drains. Rinse with running water



Dispose of gloves and apron as clinical waste. Wash hands after removing gloves and apron
